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Make Your Own Beeswax Wraps

Simply melt the grated beeswax into cotton fabric by iron with medium-low heat and baking paper.





7. Clean up tips for beeswax: hot water can melt the beeswax left from the grater. <u>But</u> <u>DON'T pour liquid wax down your drain. It</u> will solidify and cause severe blockage.

Tips:_

1. Use 100% pure and thin cotton fabric.

2. Use 12-15 grams beeswax for 25cm x 25cm size fabric, 20-25 grams for 30cm x 30cm fabric.

3. Spread the grated beeswax evenly **and to the edges.**

4. Never use high heat or leave the iron too long on the baking paper, as that will burn the beeswax and get black spots on the finished products.

5. If you use steam iron, use it as a dry iron (empty the water from the iron or set the iron to its dry heat setting), and always follow the iron instructions.

6. Add a button and twine to your wrap or use rubber band would be handy. As they are non-sticky beeswax wrap
